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1. About CHILDLINE 1098

CHILDLINE is a national, 24-hour, free emergency phone outreach service for children in need of care and protection linking them to long term rehabilitation. CHILDLINE service reaches out to children who fall prey to the gaps in the protection mechanisms in the society.

CHILDLINE India Foundation (CIF) is the nodal agency of the Union Ministry of Women and Child Development. CIF is the sole agency/body responsible for establishing the CHILDLINE service in the cities/districts of the country, monitoring of service delivery and finance, training, research and documentation, creating awareness, advocacy as well as resource generation for the service.

Major components of CHILDLINE service

- Intervention and call response.
- District level advocacy with the allied systems and stakeholders for child protection.
- Training for various departments on child protection and legal aspects.
- Sensitization programs for public.
- Encouraging child participation in policy / decision making process.

- Generate case studies, analysis and reports on various child protection issues and preventive strategies

2. CHILDLINE Thiruvananthapuram

Being a torchbearer for the entire program CHILDLINE Thiruvananthapuram is the first wing of its kind in the whole state which was started in the year 2000. Loyola Extension Services (LES) Trivandrum works as the Nodal Organization. LES along with the Collaborative agency, Don Bosco Veedu Society and Support Agency, Trivandrum Social Service Society (TSSS) has done many activities in the city for children. Providing services to the children in need of care and protection, coordinating with Government Departments, networking with the members of the allied system, organizing various programs, etc were done to prorogate the activities of CHILDLINE. CHILDLINE India Foundation is the core support for the smooth functioning of the various activities. This report is the glimpse of the activities of CHILDLINE Thiruvananthapuram during the period of 1st April 2016 to 31st March 2017.

In the year 2016-17 CHILDLINE has intervened in 1615 cases in Thiruvananthapuram district of which 645 cases were protection from abuse. Number of physical abuses cases reported in the year 2016-17 was 208.

In the year 2016-17 there were 645 cases intervened by CHILDLINE Thiruvananthapuram. Here we can see that the Physical abuse cases are high among the intervened cases. Children were even effected burns by the relatives in these cases. The second high category is sexual abuse cases. 12 child marriage cases and 22 child beggary were also reported during the year. 42 child labour cases and 20 corporal punishment cases were also reported.

Over the years there is an increase in the reporting of child sexual abuse cases through CHILDLINE Thiruvananthapuram. In the year 2012-13, 16 CSA cases were reported, during 2013-14 it rose up to 68 cases and in 2014-15 it was 103 cases. During the year 2015-16 a small decreasing in the number of CSA cases could be seen. Also in 2016-17 a small decrease can be seen. Its analysis shows that the awareness level and the CHILDLINE activities are on place now.

The data of child Sexual abuse cases intervened by CHILDLINE Thiruvananthapuram shows that both boys and girls are prone to abuse. The data also shows that boys and girls among the age group of 11 -15 years of age are more vulnerable than any other age group. It is to be noticed that 8 children below the age 6 were also sexually abused.

Abuser relationship with child

Upon analysing the data it was found that in most cases the abuser is a known person to the child or has some sort of relationship with him or her. Only 10 children were abused by others. 29 children were abused by the near relatives. It is to be noted that the children who are abused are not in a position to respond or complain since the abuser is a relative. The data also shows that highest category of abusers are neighbours

Analyzing the category of abuses faced by the children shows that more than 80% of children face high forms of sexual abuse like sexual assault or penetrative sexual assault, the rise, in number of aggravated assaults shows that the children are abused by those who were supposed to give care and protection .

The data analysis shows that the child prefers to reside in their house even though the abuser is a relative or is staying nearby. It shows that the children need care and protection of their parents, but it also has an implication of the vulnerability.

CHILDLINE services in Thiruvananthapuram have a remarkable role in helping the children in need of care and protection which is evident from the data. In 80 % of the cases follow-ups and parent sensitization were done. Follow up counseling provided to children in 86 cases. Children were helped in giving shelter. CHILDLINE team members accompanied children to record the statement. It shows the trust of child to CHILDLINE.

Continuous awareness and training programs are conducted by CHILDLINE team members for different stakeholders to equip them to report cases. Analyzing the data of person who informed the cases to CHILDLINE shows that 15 parents and 9 teachers were there. It shows that the parent sensitization and teachers awareness programs were effective. ICDS staff, doctors, police, social workers etc., also inform the cases to CHILDLINE.

Though other cases are increasing it is to be noted that the child labour cases are on the decline. Thiruvananthapuram was declared as a child labour free district in the year 2012. Most of the child laborers were from outside Kerala.

Kerala is witnessing an inflow of migrants. Many come to Trivandrum to find a job. Some of the families beg with their children to earn a living. CHILDLINE with the support of police department, CWC and DCPU, is rescuing the child and providing shelter and restoration for the family. In most of the case of child beggary the children are found with the mother or relatives.

There are instances of reporting child marriage in the district of Trivandrum. 12 cases were reported during the fiscal year out of which 7 marriages were stopped. 5 cases were reported only after marriage. It is noted that in Trivandrum all the child marriages that has been reported are from Hindu families.

The analysis also shows that the adolescent girls are victimized in child marriage. 2 children are between age 13-15 and 10 children are between the age group of 16-18. All the child marriage reported was female child marriages. In 6 cases injunction were taken. All the allied systems were used to protect children. In cases we can see that the marriage was planned by the parents. Only five cases reported elopement or marriage with the lover.

Major findings of Analysis of Protection from Abuse cases

- It is found that the children between the age of 11 to 15 are more vulnerable when the abuse cases are analyzed.
- We can mark relationship between the family background of the child and the chance of getting abused , poor orphaned, discriminated children, Children who are victims of alcoholic parents, Child whose parents are separated or divorced are more vulnerable than the normal parents.
- In almost all the cases parents know the abuser and has relationship which gives space for the abuser to abuse the child.
- The decreasing number of sexual abuse cases against children in Trivandrum district shows the awareness that is created by CHILDLINE and Government are reaching the public.
- Child Labour and Child Beggary cases are also decreasing in the district of Trivandrum.
- Though the abuser is either the neighbor or relatives, or the children are abused in the house, children like to stay with their parents in their own home.

- More than 95% of cases the abuser is known to the Child.
- Child Marriage cases need more intervention and joint awareness to be done to parents in PTAs and in other forums.

3. ADVOCACY EFFORTS

Team & Coordinators Meet

12 coordinators & 12 team meetings were held during the reporting period. Forty Eight meetings were conducted in the collaborative agency. The support team conducted forty meetings. The city coordinator visits both collab and support frequently to assess the work and to give proper guidance as and when needed. Various activities and strategies were planned during the meetings to implement the activities effectively. Staff development programs were also initiated during the period.

Directors' Meeting

Two Directors meeting were held during the reporting period. And in the meeting major decisions on awareness creation in Marriage preparation course and awareness on preventing child sexual abuse was to be done, CAB meeting, RO meeting Etc, were planned

District Collector's Meeting and DCPC Meeting

In the leadership of DCPO of Trivandrum there is regular meeting with collector to evaluate the child protection mechanisms in which childline presents the monthly case intervention and other programs. There are three District Child Protection Committee Meeting were conducted during the period. .

Networking visit of the CIF Representatives

Mr. Manoj Joseph, Senior Program Coordinator, CIF conducted two networking visits during the reporting period RRCH Chennai also visited CHILDLINE Trivandrum during the financial year. Review of the activities done by the team was done during the visit. Meetings with the Directors, Coordinators & Team members were conducted during the visit. State level networking visit also conducted to different departments of State Government during the Visit.

Trainings

A number of 138 Trainings has been conducted by CHILDLINE Trivandrum in the year 2016-17 for the stake holders, staff and children. The training for Police officials, Social work students, Teachers, Anganwady workers and helpers etc., were also conducted along with the same for students from NSS,

SPC, NCC etc., Fr. Joye James SJ, Director CHILDLINE Nodal, lead 9 sessions for the Higher secondary teachers on JJ and POCSO act in collaboration with SIEMAT and five sections for Orphanage Directors and 10 sessions for Counselors. Fr. Thomas PD also lead 9 session on JJ Act for Higher secondary teachers.

Balasaahridam: Training for Anganwady Workers/Helpers

A training program was initiated by CHILDLINE Trivandrum. Since the Anganwady teachers are working with the Adolescent groups and smaller children they should be oriented on child Protection and Laws related to children. Child Rights JJ act and Laws related to



children are covered in the sessions. During the Financial Year 6 programs were done by CHILDLINE Trivandrum. The program was arranged in collaboration with the DSJO and ICDS cell Trivandrum. CHILDLINE Collab, Support and Nodal are working together to achieve the result of to train all the anganwady workers/helpers of Trivandrum by the year 2016-17

CHILDLINE Staff Training: CHILDLINE staff was given training according to the needs. JJ Act 2015, Counseling, Communication for awareness, CSA case follow ups etc., were the topics for staff training. Experts from the field lead the session in participatory method.

Day Observances

CHILDLINE SE DOSTI WEEK 2016, November 14-20

14-11-2016: CSD Inauguration:

Child Rights week observance district level inauguration was conducted with the support of KeSCPCR, DCPU and other NGOs at Poonthura on 14-11-2016. Program started in the morning

A door to door awareness, to see the parents and adults to spread the awareness on child protection was conducted. There was a team of 30 members who were divided into 10 groups and covered all the population of Poonthura, a high density area of coastal belt. CHILDLINE awareness and child protection messages were given to the people through the volunteers of Marian College Kuttikkanam and Bharthmata College, Kottayam besides the local people of the area.



Cycle Rally

A cycle Rally was conducted with the selected children with the uniforms, in which child protection messages were attached and a placard was also given to each child. An announcement vehicle accompanied the rally with mic announcement. The Rally was flagged off by the Member of KeSCPCR Mrs.Sadhya.



Public function

The public function started with the programs by the Nirbhaya home children (Anubhava Kalavedi) Folk song, Kalaripayattu, and Vridhavadyam etc., were staged by them. A skit on Good Touch and Bad touch was performed by the Students of Poonthura School. A poster Exhibition organised by the volunteers of CHILDLINE was also done at the inauguration venue.

college, Trivandrum and Marian college Kuttikkanam along with Childline staff pasted the posters in different Police stations.

16-11-2016 Substance Abuse Program was conducted by CHILDLINE Trivandrum at various parts of the city. Taking note of the rise in drug abuse cases among school children;

the focus was on making children aware of the ill effects of drug abuse. Govt BHS Pettah was to host the inaugural ceremony of The CHIDLINE Se Dosti campaign organised by the team of CHIDLINE Trivandrum. The ceremony was witnessed by more than 200 students of the school. Fr Thomas P.D, Director, CHIDLINE Trivandrum delivered the welcome speech; expressing the importance of the cause, and how to stay away from the drug trend. During the function, a poster by the CHIDLINE Trivandrum on ‘Anti Drug Abuse’ was released by the school principal Dr Sheeja and handed over to Smt Sheelakumari, the school headmistress. Both of them spoke on the awareness campaign and the substance abuse issues among children. One of the interns at CHIDLINE, Mr Robin, a Swedish national also graced the occasion with his presence. After the official ceremony, a short video featuring actor Prithviraj called “Road Trip to Hell” by Bodhini was shown to the young



audience. Later a quiz competition was conducted by the team, on the topic, with the active participation of the students; every one of them was given prizes too. The quiz focussed on the knowledge of children on drug menace, ill effects of drugs on the body, preventive aspects and legal dimensions of drug problem. The programme ended with an awareness poster release. It was released by the principal and handed over to the headmistress to be displayed in the school.

In the latter part of the day, the team has been busy raising awareness through public address and anti drug moving exhibition. A vehicle with loud speaker made its way through the city and rural areas spreading the message against drug abuse prepared by CHIDLINE Trivandrum. This programme will be continued in other schools also.

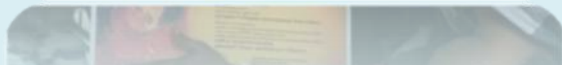
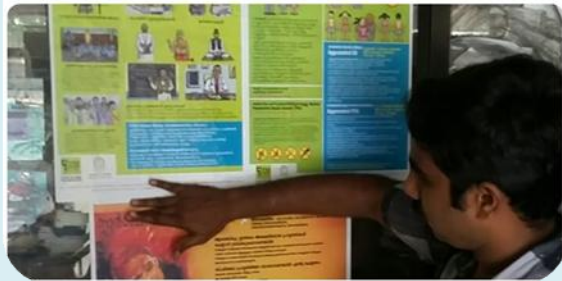
